Precepts of the Church

You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.

■ 7 capital sins

■ 3 theological virtues

faith, hope, charity (love)

■ 4 cardinal virtues

prudence, justice, temperance, fortitude

Holy Days of Obligation (in the United States)

Mary the Mother of God (Jan. 1), Mary's Assumption (Aug. 15), All Saints' Day (Nov. 1),
Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Dec. 8), Nativity of Our Lord (Christmas)
(Dec. 25)

**In the U.S., if Mary the Mother of God, the Assumption, or All Saints' Day is on a Saturday or
Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated (there is no obligation).

Works of Mercy

Corporal Works of Mercy:

Feed the hungry.
Give drink to the thirsty.
Clothe the naked.
Shelter the homeless.
Visit the sick.
Visit the imprisoned.
Bury the dead.

Spiritual Works of Mercy:

Admonish the sinner.
Instruct the ignorant.
Counsel the doubtful.
Comfort the sorrowful.
Bear wrongs patiently.
Forgive all injuries.
Pray for the living and the dead.

prayers:

Divine Mercy Chaplet

Use a regular set of rosary beads.

1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and The Apostles Creed.

2. Then on the Our Father Beads say the following:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

3. On each of the 10 Hail Mary Beads say the following:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

(Repeat steps 2 and 3 for all five decades.)

4. End with (three times):

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Benedictus (Canticle of Zachariah/Morning Prayer)

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel;
he has come to his people and set them free.
He has raised up for us a mighty savior,
born of the house of his servant David.

Through his holy prophets he promised of old
that he would save us from our enemies,
from the hands of all who hate us.
He promised to show mercy to our fathers
and to remember his holy covenant.

This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham:
to set us free from the hands of our enemies,
free to worship him without fear,
holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.

You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High;
for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way,
to give his people knowledge of salvation
by the forgiveness of their sins.

In the tender compassion of our God
the dawn from on high shall break upon us,
